MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m.

Topic: Yvonne Valdez presented the minutes from the September 2022 general meeting.

Action: Meg Kozel made a motion to approve the minutes as written, Ella Lutz-Carrillo seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Topic: Trudy Richards discussed plans for Blue & Gold Night and said that PTSA will need 15 volunteers to man the ticket and merchandise tables. Volunteers are especially needed for the 7:30-9 pm shift to help count tickets from each organization's booth. She passed around a sign-up sheet for shifts.

Action: None taken.

Topic: Lutz-Carrillo announced that membership is currently at 73 members with a goal of 200 and asked for suggestions to boost membership. Some ideas:

- Remind teachers they get academy points for joining
- Have events for kids to sign up for PTSA
- Have student PTSA meetings during the day
- Require booster club reps and student reps from each organization so we can know where each group needs help (Gloria Litt volunteered to help find reps from the boosters and start working on list)

Action: Richards will send Litt the current list and Litt will work on getting contact info for all reps.

Topic: Belynda Montgomery, fundraising chair, said that the PTSA will be doing Spirit nights monthly and she is trying to find locations that are not used by other Akins' organizations. Several suggestions were made by parents and other members, including Mod Pizza, Whataburger, etc.

Action: Montgomery will investigate member suggestions and plan for additional spirit nights.

Topic: Richards asked the attendees to break into groups to brainstorm ideas for additional PTSA events in 2022-23. When the groups presented, they suggested the following:

- Split the Pot raffle
- Candy / Pencil / Flower Grams - for different holidays

Richards noted that although we likely won't be able to do all of these, some would definitely be possible this year.

Action: The Executive Board will meet with the Campus Leadership Team to integrate some of these activities into this year's planning.

Topic: Richards presented the budget report prepared by treasurer, Nathan Willis, who was out sick. She indicated that the primary income in September came from membership dues and the primary expenses were from the portion of those dues that go to the state and national PTA organizations.

New Tech updates as of 10/5/2022

- Our journalism, yearbook, and commercial photography students are headed to a conference/competition in San Antonio this weekend.
- We have 14 Akins Film students who received scholarships to attend the Austin Film Festival at the end of this month.
- We are beginning recruitment for Code2College, an internship program to connect students with the world of compute science.
- e4Youth club has taken off for the year which connects students with creative careers. We're seeing record participation.

STEM updates as of 10/5/2022

Our students' experienced the ACC Bioscience Incubator. They also had the opportunity to analyze a protein, prepare a sample of DNA and analyze it. In addition, they had a tour in the research lab used by various companies in the field of biomedical and environmental.

Bio med also has a project on CPR Life Savings Skills. It was fully funded by Donors Choose mostly from two donors, one of which is the Akins own Cheah family. The Cheah's family has helped to fund 2 projects in my program! This project consists of 2 sets of manikin's with adult and infant for the students to practice and prepare to earn their certification in CPR/First Aid/AED.

Friday is Manufacturing Day! Austin area manufacturers open their doors for students to visit their facilities to learn about the industry. We have a group of 30 students visiting NXP Semiconductors in North East Austin.

ECHSA Updates as of 10/5/2022



- ECHS 9th graders participated in our first TSI testing push for the semester in late September. Several students became ELAR ready, which means they will now have the opportunity to take ACC courses in the spring.
- ECHS 9th graders registered for ACC through their AVID class last week. Our academy ambassadors helped this process by answering student questions and guiding students through the application process.
- Students in our Real Estate Pathway participated in a kickoff event on September 27th. Our industry partner, The Austin Board of Realtors, met with students and introduced them to work based opportunities.

AVID Updates as of 10/5/2022

- Our seniors are getting their first acceptances and scholarships!
- Akins is leading the district among AVID campuses in college acceptances, FAFSA completion and students being TSI ready.
